WHERE ARE WE NOW?

- **June 8th, GHSA allowed schools to begin conditioning**
 - **Groups of 20 including coaches**
 - **Weight training in the weight room**
 - **Conditioning at the complex**
- **June 15th, GHSA up the amount to 25**
- **June 23rd, 50 sport specific with a ball, no contact maintaining 6 ft of social distancing**



WHERE ARE WE NOW?

- June 30th, up to groups of 50 and allow the use of a equipment
- Currently, for groups of 50 or less, all shared equipment is cleaned in between groups.
- Band camp beginning July 20th
- In person graduation - July 24th



SAFETY PARAMETERS

- **Hand Sanitizer and wipes in each classroom**
- **Hand Sanitizing stations in the hallway**
- **Temperatures--taken as students enter the building and potentially again later in the day.**
 - 2 clinics: one for well students (meds) & one for sick
- **Masks are highly recommended**
- **Breakfast and lunch will be grab and go**
- **Water fountains will be closed, bottle filling stations open**
- **Classrooms will be deep cleaned every night**



INSTRUCTION

- **Instruction: Focus on most important standards**
Teachers are categorizing standards by what students need exposure to, what students need to consistently practice and what standards must be assessed.
- **Blend Social Emotional Learning with Instruction**
- **Technology: Train teachers to fully implement Google Classroom**



IN PERSON VS REMOTE

- Same teacher regardless of choice
- Google Classroom - platform that teachers use
- Record lessons each day for remote students
- Deadline day: Last day work for each unit can be turned in (generally same day as the unit summative assessment). This will apply to both remote and in person students.
- Same assignments and expectations.
- Synchronous vs. Asynchronous
- Attendance expectations



IN PERSON VS REMOTE

- How will remote learning students get the information and ask questions?
 - Teachers will record and post lessons or videos over the content
 - Teachers will schedule “Q&A” time throughout the unit
 - Students can email questions to the teachers



IN PERSON VS REMOTE

- **Can you play sports?**
 - **Yes as long as you are academically eligible. You can participate regardless of whether you do in-person or remote.**



OPEN HOUSE

- **Open House**
 - Virtual for returning students
 - In-person option for 9th grader and new to SCHS students

 - Temperature Checks,
 - Hand Sanitizing Stations,
 - Breakfast/Lunch,
